The Financial Trustee of the trust is a qualified social worker and other trustees are also qualified with various graduates and post graduations, who are committed working towards the empowerment of poor communities to improve their socio-economic, cultural, education and health empowerment. The Trust is working in Kulithalai block of Karur District of Tamilnadu, India. At present two staff members are working in the organization and we avail the services of volunteers in our developmental activities.

Activities and achievements for the year 2021-2022.

1. Children education support:

NATURE TRUST has been working with children from its foundation. Every year we are supporting education materials and tools for poor children for their education. This year also we have supported to 19 children who are studying bellow 8th standard at Government schools. They children are from dalit community, handloom weaving community, banana plantation workers community. We collect the local donations and spent for children Rs. 25687 for purchase of education materials. Er. Sathiyamoorthy distributed the education materials to the children. Even though the children are at home and attend the online classes they need writing materials to report to the school. The program was held on

2. Restore our earth program for children

Restore our earth program was conducted at Thanneerpalli Village. The program was



organised by Nature Trust. School students were oriented about the pollution on earth, air and water. An interaction session was made with them. After interaction session, they took an oath to avoid plastic materials at their house and schools. They assure that they will put their effort to mitigate earth from pollution. A rally was conducted at Sedar street. Five provision shops were provided with one and two kgs content of

paper bags to pack the kitchen things like dhall, sugar, rice, etc,.... Nearly fifteen children participated in the program. Ward Member Mrs. Kowsalya Boopathi participated and distributed the paper bags.

3. Training on Napkin production

Resuable Cloth Sanitary Napkin production training was given for women in Parali Village on 19.07.2021. Fifteen women participated in the workshop. It was a one day

program. An orientation was given on menstrual health issues. The need and importance of reusable sanitary pads were made realised for the gatherings.

The way of cutting the clothes, shaping it, stitching, buttoning skills were taught. The shape was drawn in chart, then cut on the line, carved and took the design separately. It was placed in the fabric and beneficiaries



tried cutting the fabric on the design. Then, shaping, stitching and buttoning were also tried.

The beneficiaries were very much satisfied on the program. They said, they will free from menstrual health issues and will get healthy menstrual days by using cloth pads. They also added that they will free from economic crisis which reduce the hospital charges.

4. Neuro theraphy health camp

One day Neuro Therapy free health camp was organised by Nature Trust on 18th March 2021 at Aringar Anna Samuthaya koodam, Kulithalai. The Municipal Chairman Mrs.



Sakunthala Pallavi Raia. Vice-Chairman Mr. Ganesan. Ward Counsellor Mr. Sakthivel, Chief Guest Dr. Sumathi Senthil Nathan, Assistant Professor, Seetha Lakshmi Ramasamy College, Trichy and Senior Neuro Consultant Mr. Raman Ji presented and lightened the lamp. Mr. Raman Ji gave orientation on Neuro Therapy and its benefits for chronic and acute diseases. Mrs. Sumathi Senthil Nathan gave awareness on general health for men, women as well as children.

The Therapists Mrs. Gajalakshmi from Thirupur, Vasumathi from Bangalore, Vasanthi from Chidambaram, Abirami from Thanneerpalli were participated and treated the patients in the camp. Lunch was provided for the therapists and patients who were available on the time in the camp spot.

The camp was held for the whole day. One hundred and thirty patients were participated including male, female and children and got benefitted. Three Persons with Disabilities were also participated and got benefitted in the camp. They said that they were very much satisfied with the therapy and their diseases we recovered

immediately to some extent. The beneficiaries also said that they will continue the therapy for their speedy and long term relief.

5. Artificial jewel making training

One day workshop on artificial jewel making training was organised by Nature Trust on 07.07.2021in Thanneerpalli Village. Artificaial ornaments were organised and training was given for thirty two women in and around Thanneerpalli village to make the artificial jewels. The women were participated and learned many new items to make and happy on the program. During feedback session, they shared that, the workshop may mitigate them from family economic crisis. The beneficiaries assured that they can stand in their own legs. In future they can male this as a business and free from economic dependence.

6. Collective farming training

Collective farming training organised for farmers in Thannerpalli, Parali and Rajendiram village farmers on 19.09.2021. The farmers were collected and organised in a common place for awareness on collective farming training. They were explained with the guidelines of collective farming, pros and cons of collective farming. Success stories of the concept also shared in the meeting. Farmers asked various questions regarding SHG, bank details, bank transactions, and other details. All were explained and cleared. Farers also shared their experience in farming, ploughing, seeding, weeding, and cultivating.

7. Covid relief Food

Covid Relief food was distributed in and around villages of Thanneerpalli. The street dwellers were concentrated more in this food distribution process. The food and water was served for all the three times per day. For breakfast, idli and dosa with chutney and sambar, variety rice for noon meal and idli for dinner was served. Our volunteers travel

around 30 kms per day to cover the surrounding villages. A local homemade hotel was utilised for the food preparation. The street dwellers were also provided with face mask, lungies, shirts and dothies. The beneficiaries were felt happy and shared that they were blessed to get enough food in the pandemic situation; some of the dwellers ventilate their psychological emotion with our volunteers. Our volunteers spend some time with the beneficiaries and



shared their psychological ventilations. Few of the dwellers were taken to hospitals for their physical health issues. More than hundred dwellers were benefitted through this program.

8. Covid face mask distribution 11100

Cotton cloth washable face mask was distributed in the pandemic period. The street dwellers, scavengers, health and sanitary workers were concentrated more in the process. The fabrics from Karur Textile was purchased, cut and stitched. Then Elastic was fixed. Single layer and double layer mask was stitched and distributed to the beneficiaries. More than five hundred members were benefitted in this program.



The volunteers of our organisation travel around the nearby villages, meet the low grade workers, women, children, low income people for distributing the face mask.

9. The Board Meetings:

During the reporting period, we have conducted 4 board meetings in which we discussed the programs, finance, policy matters and recorded the minutes properly. It was decided to purchase necessary furniture to the office as well as training program. The attendance was 85%. No salary or honorarium was paid to the Managing Trustee or Trustees. The trustees reimbursed their amount spent for the objects of the society.
